



PUBLIC RESPONDS TO SCREENINGS

According to a study from BMJ Oncology released in fall 2023, cancer rates worldwide have risen dramatically in people under the age of 50.

Researchers examined data from 204 countries between 1990 and 2019. They found that there were more than 3.26 million early-onset cancer cases reported in those countries in 2019, up from 1.82 million in 1990, an increase of 79.1%.

The study defined early-onset cancer as a diagnosis that occurs between the ages of 14 and 49.

To help detect those early on-set cases in the communities served by Blessing Health, our team has a goal to increase participation in cancer screenings by 10%. In the pages of this 2022 Annual Report you will see we exceeded that goal in several screening programs.

Other exceptional news in this report includes Milestones and Accomplishments, Clinical Research Enrollment, and Survivorship Activities and Services.

The accomplishments highlighted in this report are the results of the commitment and dedication of each Blessing Health provider and support staff member who proudly delivers oncology care and services.



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
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Patient Data: Total Patients, Quincy/Pittsfield/Hannibal







Patient Data: Cancers Treated, Quincy
