Inpatient Medical Rehabilitation Unit

Blessing Hospital operates an 18-bed acute, inpatient medical rehabilitation unit in Quincy, IL. The unit is nationally accredited by CARF and the commission on accreditation of rehabilitation facilities.

The goal of the rehabilitation unit is to maximize the functional independence of the person served by restoring or compensating for physical and/or cognitive impairment in order to promote re-entry into the community.

An experienced and highly skilled interdisciplinary team of therapists and nurses collaborate with the person served to develop and carry out the treatment plan. Many staff members have specialty certifications including Certified Rehabilitation Registered Nurse® and Certified Brain Injury Specialist. This skilled team has experience working with many types of impairments resulting from spinal cord injuries, brain injuries, amputations, arthritis, stroke, fractures, multiple trauma, neuromuscular disease, and other orthopedic/neurological diagnoses.

Our rehab unit physiatrist, John DeGuzman, MD, is a specialist in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. The director of Rehabilitation is Karen Kerns, M.S., CCC-SLP, MBA.

Miscellaneous Information

Nursing:

- Average nursing hours per patient day = 7.98
- Average daily census = 13.7
- Six registered nurses are certified in rehab nursing.
- Two registered nurses are certified as brain injury specialists.
- All RNs must complete an intensive Rehab nursing course within the first year of employment.

Therapists:

- Physical Therapy staff assigned to the Rehab Unit have an average of 29 years experience.
- Occupational Therapy staff to the Rehab Unit have an average of 15 years experience.
- Speech Language Pathologists assigned to the Rehab Unit have an average of 14 years of experience.

Three hours of therapy (OT/PT/ST) is offered at least five days per week. Therapy is also provided on Saturday, up to three hours if indicated.
